

offender! In the original movie screenplay (for which he won an Academy Award) and in the subsequent Tony winning book for the musical, Mel Brooks takes aim at a wide range of stereotypical Broadway characters, skewers them all, sometimes jaw-droppingly so. Yet somehow in this zany jokefest he manages to deftly include the key ingredient of a terrific musical – heart.

The story is simple: a down-on-hisluck Broadway producer, Max Bialystock learns from his naïve accountant, Leo Bloom, that he can actually make more money by producing a flop than a hit. Max manages to lure the mousy Leo to quit his job as an accountant and become his partner in crime as a Broadway producer and then work their plan. Step one: find a sure fire flop of a script (from former Nazi and third Reich fanatic turned playwright Franz Leibkind). Step Two: hire the worst director (the flamboyantly fay Roger DeBris). Step Three: raise the money by bilking little old ladies out of millions (how he gets the money is why this show is PG-13!). Step four: hire the worst performers (including their new Swedish blonde bombshell actress/receptionist; Ulla) and produce the most offensive show in the history of Broadway: Springtime for Hitler. Once the show opens and closes in the same night, run off to Rio with the money. Only one thing goes awry: the show is a smash hit! To make matters worse, the playwright is enraged that his play has become a masterpiece of ridicule for the Fuhrer and goes after Max and Leo like a Sherman tank. Will they get away? Come find out.

Director Manny Cafeo, who won the Montie Award for Best Show of the Year as director of our smash hit Singin' in the Rain has put together a dream cast and crew for this outrageous show. Manny brought back renown chorographer Dinah Mahlman, musical director Ana Guirola-Ladd, set design Denise De-Bold and stage manager Jill Villalobos from his award winning production

team from Singin' in the Rain. Leading the cast as Max Bialystock is Jeffrey L. Baldwin. Jeff last appeared on the Crighton stage as Shrek in Shrek The Musical this past summer. His partner in crime, Leo Bloom, will be played by Timothy Eggert. While new to STAGE RIGHT our audiences will be familiar with Tim from is work at the Owen Theatre, most recently in Almost, Maine. Blonde bombshell Ulla is played by STAGE RIGHT favorite Sara Preisler. Sara won a Montie Award as Best Actress in a Musical for her lovely performance as Kathy Selden in Singin' in the Rain last year. The deranged Franz Leibkind is played by another STAGE RIGHT veteran and audience favorite: Katt Gilcrease. Katt was just seen as the kidney stone suffering Dub Dubberly in Christmas Belles. Another new face in our cast is that of the flaming Roger De-Bris played by Clinton Jeter. This marks the first time Clinton will be performing on the Crighton stage but audiences will be familiar with his fine work at the Owen. As Roger's common-law assistant Carmen Ghia, Ryan Rodriguez will add a dash of panache to this light-in-theloafers role.
