Art and Culture of Montgomery County (ACMC), an information hub for non-profit art and cultural groups, will showcase their many talents at the upcoming **Woodlands Waterway Arts Festival**, set for Saturday, April 14 and Sunday, April 15 from 10 am – 6 pm along **The Woodlands Waterway®** and in **Town Green Park**.

Now in its second year of development, ACMC features an ever-expanding repertoire of talented individuals committed to their crafts, according to Festival Director **Jenny Wright**. “We hope that everyone attending the festival will stop by the Art and Culture area to visit with the many groups represented and enjoy their wonderful performances.”

Returning to the festival this year will be **The Bravo Company, Crighton Players, Christian Youth Theater** and **Stage Right** performing a broad spectrum of performance clips for upcoming shows at nearby theaters. Members of the **Greater Conroe Arts Alliance** including **Conroe Art League, Friends of The Flag, Heritage Museum, Montgomery County Choral Society** and the **Montgomery County Literary Arts Council** will be distributing information about membership and upcoming events.

New to the festival is **The Woodlands Show Chorus**, a new choir of The Woodlands made up of 68 strong vocalists who will make beautiful music at the festival. “Anyone who hears them is in for a treat,” Wright said.

Also joining the festival for the first time will be **Lone Star College-Montgomery’s Drama Department** and the **DJ Mac Band** made up of faculty from the Lone Star music department. The band will also accompany students from **Northwood Art School’s drama department** when they sing tunes from **School House Rock**. Also, **Robby Wood**, Professor of Art at LSC-Montgomery will be demonstrating clay throwing and pottery making on his wheel on Saturday, April 14.

Stage Right will also be presenting a professional storyteller, **Leona Hoegsberg**, who will be enthralling listeners with **The Bookworm with Stories for the Young and the Young at Heart**.

Performances and times will be posted in the program distributed at the festival.
