

STAGE RIGHT to honor WWII veteran in NO TIME FOR SERGEANTS

STAGE RIGHT of Texas, resident theatre company at the historic Crighton Theatre in downtown Conroe, will be honoring World War II veterans through a special presentation of NO TIME FOR SERGEANTS on Sunday September 12th at 2 pm. Members of the Lone Star Honor Flight will be the honored guests and receive complimentary tickets for the September 12 special performance. Additionally, all active duty military and veterans will be admitted free to the special performance on the 12th but must call the box office to reserve a seat. All others will pay regular price for tickets.

Lone Star Honor Flight, founded by Montgomery resident Brenda Beaven, has taken over 1,500 World War II veterans to Washington D.C.

to see the World War II memorial and other historic sites. Brenda started Lone Star Honor Flight in 2008 after learning about a man out of North Carolina who was taking World War II vets to D.C.

NO TIME FOR SERGEANTS made Andy Griffith a star on Broadway and tells the story of Will Stockdale, a country bumpkin from Georgia, and his hilarious attempts to be classified for duty in the Air Force of the late 1950s. Will's simple country ways drive those around him crazy, no one more so than his Sergeant. Once classified, Will and his unassuming friend Ben are off on a high flying explosive adventure that could ruin the careers of not only Sergeant King, but a few Generals as well!

The show will be presented at the historic Crighton Theatre at 234 N. Main Street in downtown Conroe, TX. Regular show dates are Sept. 10-26, 2010. Show times are Friday and Saturday evenings at 8 pm with two Sunday matinees on Sept. 19 & 26 at 2 pm. Tickets are \$17 for adults, \$15 for seniors and \$12 for youth and students with college ID.
